All students will be supported to develop their identity by differentiated pathways while acknowledging that their individual cultures and personal identities are sources of strength.









ENROLMENT PROCESS FOR 2025

- Find My School findmyschool.vic.gov.au check that you are in our zone
- All schools follow the DE Enrolment Guidelines & Policies (zone, siblings)
- If Bemin Secondary College is your designated school, we will accept you.
- Year 6 students in government schools will receive the Year 6 to 7 Placement Information Pack 2024-25 (including application form) from their primary school -- return forms to your primary school, who will process them.
- Year 6 students in non-government schools can download the *Application for Year 7 Placement 2025 form* from the school website and return it to Bemin Secondary College by Friday, May 10th 2024.
- All families will need to provide documentation, including proof of address, birth certificates, prior academic reports etc in order to finalise your child's enrolment.
